Update on activity at the Lakeside and Haverthwaite Railway - January 2024

As 2023 closes we can reflect on a pretty good year - and certainly one that more than justifies the 'cautiously optimistic' view we had when the season started. Thanks, of course, go to all those that make it happen; the board of directors (particularly the executive directors - Mike and Karen Maher), the staff, our contractors (particularly Alex Sharphouse and his John Fowler & Co. team), all the volunteers at Haverthwaite - and those who have supported us doing

work from other sites.

The Tinsel trains were not without their challenges. On Saturday Dec 2nd it started to snow heavily. Although a Christmas winter wonderland was created (photo right), so were the travel problems. On the following morning there was 15cm of snow lying on the Haverthwaite car park and many roads were impassable. With the police advising people not to travel in the Lake District area we had no option



but to cancel the Sunday trains. This is the first time we can remember (for several decades) that we have failed to run an advertised day's service.

Barclay 'David' (seen arriving at Lakeside in the photo - right) hauled the trains on the first two weekends but then needed its firebox 'brick arch' replacing and so Barclay No. 1245 took charge of the final weekend services.





The rivet blanks are on order for assembly of the new rear horizontal stretcher (photo below). The Wednesday crew volunteers have worked well to complete the surface preparation and painting of the frames and vertical stretchers that would ultimately be less accessible beneath the new fabrication.


